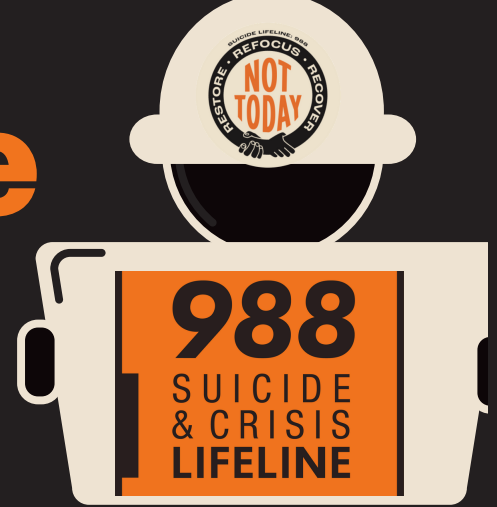


It is okay to talk about **Suicide**

KNOW THE RISKS

- **Construction has the Highest Number of Male Suicide Deaths.**
- The CDC reports that 20% of all men who die by suicide were in construction/extraction.
- The construction industry has the second-highest suicide rate of any industry in the US.

In 2022, the rate of suicides in construction was **6x** greater than the rate for all fatal work-related injuries



If you are having suicidal thoughts, seek support, call or text the 988 Lifeline, call a local crisis number, or reach out to a trusted family member or friend.



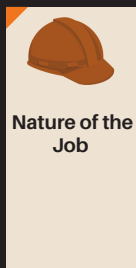
Check-In with your health care provider to discuss what you are thinking and how you are feeling.



Suicidal Thoughts are a symptom, just like any other - they can be treated, and they can improve over time.



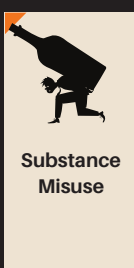

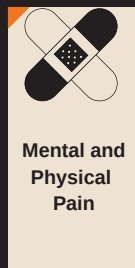
